Our Curriculum

Our curriculum content is informed by the National Curriculum for Years 1-4 and the EYFS Framework for Reception. We deliver core subjects which are: English (Reading and Writing), Mathematics, Science and RE as well as foundation subjects which are: Computing, History, Geography, Physical Education, Music, Art, Design Technology, History, Geography and a Modern Foreign Language.

Together they:

- Promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils within school.
- Prepare pupils at school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

We ensure all children have access to a broad, balanced and far-reaching curriculum. We are inclusive in our approach and have high expectations for all. Quality first teaching is a priority so that children have the very best teaching we can offer. Our thematic approach to our curriculum provides opportunities for children to access an immersive and deep education with a focus on progression in their skills within each subject area. Thoughtfully planned experiences are delivered to meet the needs and interests of children.

Assessment, Achievement & Reporting

Every child's progress is continually assessed by their class teacher. Each individual pupil is monitored for their attainment and progress in relation to their prior attainment and targets. Pupil progress meetings take place twice a term to discuss pupils on an individual basis and ensure that

we are meeting all children's needs. Teacher assessment takes place termly and this is supported by children completing assessments each term. These are delivered in a sensitive manner and within a relaxed and supportive environment. Communication is key to ensure parents and carers are informed of their child's progress and we operate an open door policy to maintain communication. Children receive an annual report at the end of the year.

Forest School and Outdoor Learning

We take full advantage of our beautiful surroundings, with Forest School a regular lesson on the timetable for all children, throughout the year. We regularly go on walks around our local area, visiting Hanbury Hall, Church and the village.

Outdoor learning areas have been specifically designed for children to discover and explore to further their development.

Year 4 annually enjoy a residential trip. The three day visit includes adventurous outdoor activities including climbing towers, low ropes, problem solving, night walk, zip line and many more activities.

Extra-Curricular Activities

We attend sports festivals, music events and workshops along with whole-school trips to the pantomime and an end of term adventure! These are complemented by our diverse range of extra-curricular after school clubs which offer children the chance to develop their personal skills, creativity and talent.



Wrap Around Care and Holiday Club



We offer our own in-house wrap around care. Staff are consistent and build relationships with children to offer a purposeful and stimulating breakfast and afterschool club that is tailored to the children. We offer the following wrap around care options.

Breakfast Club: 7:45am until the start of the school day (Breakfast is available to all children until 8.15am)

Afterschool club: Runs at the end of the school day until 6pm.

Please note that children can attend wrap around care after an extracurricular club in school. During after school club children will be fed a snack such as a bagel, wrap or similar. A menu will be shared so you are aware of what your child will eat. We cater for allergens so please share this information when you complete your registration forms.

We recognise the ever-changing need of families and that working patterns and other commitments can lead to challenges for childcare. We offer our own holiday clubs at half terms, one week at Easter and for three weeks during the summer holiday. We are closed over Christmas. This is on school site and is staffed by our school staff to ensure children have consistency of adults in a safe and secure environment that they know.



Religious Education and Collective Worship



We are a Church of England school provide invitational and we opportunities whole-school for worship collective every day. Religious Education is compulsory for all pupils registered in maintained schools and at Hanbury we follow the Worcestershire agreed syllabus alongside Understanding Christianity. We approach our teaching through 'Big Questions' and creative teaching.

Child Protection & Safeguarding

Our school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all our children and we work hard to create a happy, stimulating and secure environment which fosters in children an active role in their wellbeing and learning.

We adopt an 'open door' policy with parents, encouraging meetings with teachers and staff to discuss any matters. We involve parents with school matters through regular parent questionnaires, curriculum open classroom afternoons, weekly newsletter and specific information events such as reading, phonics and mathematics.

Regular school attendance is important so that children develop and improve social skills, confidence and have more opportunities to progress in their learning. If you have any barriers to regular school attendance we will offer support through the class teacher, senior leadership team and SENCo where appropriate.
