### Introduction:

The Sport Industry Research Centre at Sheffield Hallam University has been contracted by Sport England to conduct an independent validation on 325 schools covering 225 SGO areas for the 2015/16 period. As part of our validation visits we have been asked to make recommendations regarding improving the Mark criteria for future years and therefore the criteria for this year is again subject to changes based on the feedback we receive and the validations completed. Hanbury CofE First School provided evidence of meeting or exceeding the required criteria in order to achieve the Silver School Games Mark. The key School Games Mark criteria relating to the Silver award are highlighted below and a green /red score has been made in relation to the evidence seen or discussed with the validation team.

### Comments

Hanbury CofE First School received a validation call for their application for a Mark award on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2016 and based on the evidence discussed and presented the school has achieved the Silver Mark award for 2015/16 (an upgrade from Bronze based on the original application submitted).

Hanbury is a small first school with only 41 pupils on roll at KS2 during 2015/16. Despite this they were able to evidence a strong portfolio of evidence which supports their commitment to school sport and the School Games programme. Notably:

- A clear tracking system is in place which records pupils' participation in the School Games - including clubs and competitions.
- All pupils are provided with at least 2 hours of curriculum time PE per week
- An average of 3 extracurricular sporting clubs take place during an average week and all pupils attend at least one club a week.
- Level 1 competitions are encouraged at the end of every unit of PE work, furthermore athletics and football forms a key part of the school competitive offer at Level 1.
- A total of 12 Level 2 competitions were entered into (in 7 different sports) and a B teams was entered into in the tag rugby competition.
- 63% of pupils are engaged in leading, managing and officiating School Games activity. This is via the Sports crew as well as the play leaders who are actively engaged in organising competitions as part of lunchtime activity.

There are two areas of the criteria which the school should concentrate on if they are to aspire to achieve the Gold Mark award in future years. These are as follows:

- Promotion of School Games to parents and the local community would need to take place on at least a fortnightly basis. The school has recently introduced a school Facebook page and also has a twitter account which could act as forums to increase this promotion. Use of the School Games name and logos are encouraged for all promotional activity.
- Active links with local sports clubs. Currently the school is able to evidence 4 active links (tri golf, hockey, netball and rugby). A further two active links would be required for the Gold level award.
