

Key Vocabulary

Season: a part of the year.

Winter: the season after autumn and before spring.

Weather: the conditions outside.

Rain Gauge: a container used to measure the amount of rainfall over a period of time.

Daylight: natural light from the sun.

Night: a period of darkness each day where there is no sunlight.

Rain: water droplets.

Snow: water droplets that have frozen into ice crystals and fall as flakes.

Frost: ice crystals which have formed on the ground or other surfaces due to low temperatures.

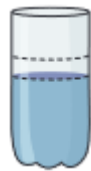
Sun: a source of heat and light on Earth.

Cloud: visible watery vapour in the sky.

Wind: the movement of air blowing from a direction.

Sticky Knowledge

- There are objects associated with winter such as pine cones, holly, leaves, gloves, hat and scarves.
- There are fewer hours of daylight in winter.
- In winter the nights are longer.
- There are some changes in plant and animal life.
- Some trees have no leaves during this time of year.
- In winter the weather is colder compared to the rest of the year.
- The weather conditions change and we may observe rain, ice or snow.
- It does not always snow in winter.
- There are four seasons in a year.
- The seasons are spring, summer, autumn and winter.
